FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

Lake Fork Stables is a small organization with a small budget. We depend on a few paid services in the form of paid riding lessons, horseback riding excursions, camps, clinics, and birthday parties. All of our other funding comes from the generosity of individual donors, a single grant and our fundraising campaigns. Our three largest fundraisers this year were:

East Texas Giving Day - \$742 raised 1st Annual Run for the Roses Virtual Gala - \$582 1st Annual Farm Fall Festival - \$4000

Facebook fundraisers have also been very instrumental in the success of Riders Up! Our Facebook fundraisers have raised over \$2500.

PROGRAMS

Lake Fork Stables offers the following programs. Enrollment for each program varies based on a family's needs and financial situation:

Riders Up! - Free and reduced rate lessons for low income, autistic, and foster kids.

Horses4Heroes - Half price riding lessons for military and first responder families. Families join the Horses4Heroes program that provides them with the opportunity to receive half-priced lessons no matter where they are in the United States at partner barns.

Horse Sense Equine Therapy Retreats – Families of autistic children are invited on a scholarship basis to join us at Stable View Cottages and Lake Fork Stables for a relaxing weekend of equine therapy using the Horse Boy Method.


Working Student Program – Our working student program provides teenagers interested in working in the equine industry the opportunity to gain hands-on stable management experience while receiving free training lessons in return.

Just For Kids Horsemanship Clinics - New for 2021 is our Just For Kids clinics. These clinics will be themed and include fun games and exercises designed to teach children how to train their own horses. These clinics are designed for kids interested in or already participating in 4H, FFA, or horse showing in general.

What's even better is when you see it come full circle and have one child on the spectrum helping another.

Increase community support via activities and events at the farm.


Continue to improve our facilities to provide a better learning environment for our kids including an outdoor classroom, and play area for siblings.
